Background:

The Institute of Psychotherapy and Psychotraumatology is a joint project between the University of Duhok in Kurdistan region of Iraq and the State University of Baden Württemberg, institute of transcultural health sciences in Germany

This project is implemented in partnership with the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH, Civil Peace services CPS project in Duhok. The project will be executed in Sinjar district, Sinoni sub-district.

Duties and Responsibilities

Under the direct supervision of team leader and project coordinator the Enumerators for Data Collection will conduct the following duties;

- Conduct structured interviews with participants using standardized psychological instruments (e.g., SCID-5, Y-BOCS-II, PDS, PCL-5, BDI-II, and related scales).
- Ensure full understanding and accurate administration of questionnaires according to training.
- Obtain informed consent from all participants prior to data collection, ensuring voluntary participation.
- Record responses accurately on tablets or online forms (as assigned).
- Ensure participant privacy and data confidentiality throughout the process.
- Identify and report any adverse events or participant distress to the Field Supervisor immediately.
- Participate in pre-data collection training on tools, ethics, and data management.



- Conduct pilot testing of the instruments as directed.
- Maintain daily communication with the management team
- Submit completed questionnaires and progress reports daily.
- Report any operational, logistical, or ethical issues encountered in the field.
- Accurate and verified data for all assigned participants in line with sampling plans.
- Completed daily and weekly field activity reports.
- Compliance with IPP's research ethics and data quality standards.
